ABOUT THE WORKSHOP

ARCHIP



The ARCHIP *Bridging Prague* Summer Workshop is a **three**week intensive study and life experience, based in **Prague**, **Czech Republic**. "Golden Prague" has been described as "the most beautiful city in Europe" and almost every architectural expression is well represented here- Gothic, Romanesque, Neo-Classical, Art Nouveau, Art Deco, Functionalist and Modern. Prague's historic core, fundamentally unchanged since the 14th century, has been a **UNESCO** World Cultural Heritage site since 1992.

Participants will propose architecture, landscape architecture

and planning urban interventions onto the iconic **Vlatava riverbank**, one of the richest historic architectural environments in Central Europe. Through urban analysis of existing conditions and the context, students will propose an appropriate contemporary intervention(s) responding to scale, massing, materials and the existing cultural context of Prague.

The workshop will start with an intensive historical and contextual site analysis, led by respected Czech historians, urban planners and architects. At the end of the first week, participants will begin to develop a personal intervention, which could be architectural, site- or landscape-based.

There will be a guided component of the program, where students will study other iconic urban, architectural and historic sites in Prague.

ABOUT ARCHIP

ARCHIP is a private College of Architecture located in the center of Prague, Czech Republic. It offers a threeyear Bachelor of Architecture degree, in English, accredited by the Czech Ministry of Education, and reciprocal within the EU. Our standard, rigorous course of study is 180 credits. ARCHIP is the only institution of its type in the Czech Republic and is striving to become a center for innovative education, architectural theory and interdisciplinary design.

FACILITIES

ARCHIP's studios are based in the Kartographie Museum, in the historic Holesovice neighborhood, just across the VItava River from historic Old Town Prague and an easily accessible distance from the Workshop site. Participants will have studio access and a personal workspace in an open studio setting. WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES

The foci of "Bridging Prague" will be threefold:

1) To **encourage critical analysis** of traditional European urbanism and architecture and the implications and effects of modern interventions.

2) To **work in a multi-disciplinary context** to encourage a holistic approach to architecture, planning, landscape architecture and urbanism.

3) To **provide "real world" solutions** for the address of the Vltava River banks, with an eye to the long-term planning goals for the city to better address use of public space and pedestrian mobility along the river.

WORKSHOP COST

1120 Euro/ \$1,500 USD (including accommodation)

or transportation costs back to the student's home country from Prague

- Food or beverages
- Personal drawing materials (pens, pencils, markers, tracing paper)
- Personal health or travel insurance (note: Proof of health insurance is required for a student visa)

ACCOMMODATIONS

Participants will be housed (20 nights) in modern, furnished, shared suites. Typically, there will be multiple beds (2 or more) per room and shared bathrooms. The rooms will be simple and practically furnished. If individual participants would prefer private or double rooms, as opposed to dormitory-style, this can be arranged for an additional fee, and would pay the difference, in addition to basic housing fee.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

May 31, 2013

Maximum of **fifteen (15)** participants. All architecture, planning or landscape architecture students who are currently enrolled or have been admitted to an accredited program are eligible to apply. Students will be accepted first on the basis of merit and then on a first-come, first-served basis. E-mail confirmation of acceptance (within 7-10 days of application submittal)- last applicant notified by: **May 31, 2013**

Reciprocity of Credits

ARCHIP will award three (3) academic credits for full, successful participation in the Workshop. ARCHIP's Bachelor Degree in Architecture Program is accredited by the Czech Ministry of Education. A degree granted is recognized by all other accredited Schools of Architecture in other EU nations. Visiting foreign students are urged to verify with their home institution that credits received will apply towards their degree program and must supply any and all forms or paperwork from their home institutions. At the end of the Summer Program, ARCHIP will issue an official transcript verifying each student's participation and mark.

Visas

For certain countries, stays of less than 90 days in the Czech Republic do not require a visa. Foreign nationals must contact the Czech embassy in their home country to obtain up-to-date information on the visa requirements for study or tourist purposes. Czech is a member of the European Union (EU). Citizens of the EU, the European Economic Area (EEA) and of Switzerland do not require visas.

Health Care

Personal health or travel insurance is not included in the Program Cost, and students must show proof of health insurance to obtain a student visa. Many private health-care providers speak English, and English-speaking medical facilities, such as the Canadian Medical Centre (www.cmcpraha.com) are available for more serious conditions. The RMA Centrum (Dukelsych hrdinu 17, Prague 7) has physicians for all ailments, and is the basic healthcare provider for ARCHIP's students.
